Counselor's Column

Safe Passage Sexual Assault Counselors, Liz and Kate, have been offering a weekly Creative Arts Group for survivors of sexual violence since July 2018. This group provides an opportunity for trauma survivors to process their abuse experiences through the use of art.



Many survivors are unable to express their trauma using words, so this group allows them to process their feelings through the creation of art. Clients have access to several different media, including water colors, colored pencils, and paints. In a recent group the facilitators provided the prompt, "What does healing look like for you?", and then allowed the clients a safe, calming space to begin creating.

The facilitators are mindful of creating a space that is calming to all the senses, including the use of relaxing background music and aromatherapy. The creation of art in a safe, nonjudgmental space can allow survivors to gain insights about themselves and their healing that they may not have been able to access in other ways.
