Male Survivors: We're here for you!

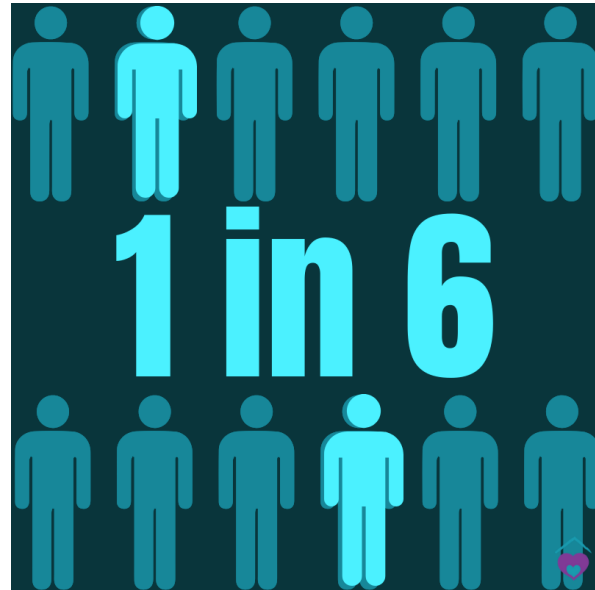
Did you know 1 in 6 men will experience sexual violence in their lifetime and 1 in 7 men will be experience severe physical abuse over the course of their life?

Male survivors of domestic and sexual violence often face additional barriers to seeking counseling services. One of those barriers is believing that they are not eligible for services at domestic violence and rape crisis centers. Male survivors who have come into services at Safe Passage have said "I didn't realize I could come here—I thought it was only for women." While domestic violence and rape crisis centers were established

originally by women for women survivors, we recognize that there are male survivors that are also in need of services.

Male survivors often feel a sense of shame, questioning of their own masculinity, and increased rates of isolation and stigmatization due to their abuse experiences. Boys and men have been socialized to not show vulnerable emotions and have been discouraged from seeking out help when they are struggling. The counselors at Safe Passage are equipped to help these male survivors process their trauma and the feelings of shame, sadness, fear, confusion, anxiety, and depression that accompany their experiences.
