Counselor's Column

What is IPSV?

Intimate Partner Sexual Violence (IPSV) is a form of domestic violence in which an abusive partner engages in sexually abusive or coercive behaviors in an effort to gain or maintain power and control in a relationship. Some examples of IPSV include unwanted sexual touching, making derogatory sexual comments, forced sex, and making someone feel guilty for not wanting to be sexually intimate. The counselors at Safe Passage have noticed a high percentage of victims reporting this type of abuse, although it is unlikely that a



victim will report IPSV unless she is specifically asked about it. Experiencing IPSV in an intimate relationship results in higher levels of trauma-related emotional and physical health

symptoms than domestic violence victims who don't report experiencing IPSV. Counselors in either the domestic violence or sexual assault counseling programs are here to assist clients who have experienced this type of abuse.
