1970s

DeKalb County community members open their homes for victims of domestic violence seeking safety

1981

Safe Passage is founded to provide shelter and professional support for victims

1990s

Offender Intervention services added to focus on ending violence at its source

2003

Sexual assault crisis center services added to better support survivors and prevent violence in DeKalb County

Shelter | Counseling | Advocacy

- Free and confidential services are available for survivors 24/7
- Shelter can hold 25 clients in 5 bedrooms and 2 bathrooms



On average Safe Passage receives 60% more requests for shelter than available space each month.
