Raised Donors Organizations

As a whole, 140 nonprofits in Dekalb County and 2,780 donors nationwide were able to raise over \$1.5 million for this event. Last year Safe Passage raised \$61,003. This year we not only surpassed our amount from last year's Give Dekalb County, but we were able to raise almost 2x our original goal of \$40,000. We've been saying it nonstop, but thank you. 41 years of operation wouldn't be possible without our continuous support from our community.

Wish lists also will be available at the show. Gifts also can be dropped off at Eagle Country Markets, both DeKalb locations, through Dec. 11.

Some of the items on the Christmas Wish List are: art supplies; large plain white t-shirts and fabric paints; beads for jewelry; non-violent videos, toys and games; books; Jigsaw puzzles; make up for adults and toiletries; stationery; mittens and gloves; scarves; sweat pants and tops; socks; sleepwear.
